Situation: Marianne, Jeff & Jacob of RoseLawn Dairy, Pine City MN, have a free stall that is approximately 200 yards from the milking facility.. See red arrow indicating walk. Free Stall barns have curtains which help insulate the barns from the wind but cows are still subjected to the cold winter temperatures. The long walk exposes them to cold wind chills in excess of 30 below. The RoseLawn farm has been using Recover for (4) years with limited issues in regards to frozen teat ends.
